



Regional security complex (Buzan & Wæver, 2003)





Assessing the impact of US primacy in a regionalised world

- In hegemonic regionalism theory (Katzeinstein, World of regions in American Imperium, 2005), Germany is identified as a nodal state instrumental to US security influence in Europe. However, Germany's diplomacy (e.g., on the Iraqi war) doesn't always fit with this argument. Please use the framework of regional security complex to explain it.
- Considering the <u>future of "New Regionalism"</u> under the constrains of unipolarity and globalization. As the US faces growing obstacles in exerting direct influences around the world, the potential for regional initiatives to develop autonomously has grown. Under such circumstances, how would the US respond to the growing influences of new regionalism?
